
ARCW Digital Preservation Project

- Co-ordinated by the Archives and Records Council Wales Digital Preservation Group (ARCWDP).
- Founded in 2009 to achieve the ARCW strategic objective: "To address the preservation and maintenance of digital records and the provision of access."
- Based on assumptions
 - that no one organisation could deliver for all
 - little additional funding available
 - differing requirements: access, storage, system integrations

Business Case


8 objectives

- Collection of digital material from all sources
- Facilitation of deposit and metadata creation
- Provision of secure and trusted storage
- Appropriate, sustainable administration
- Support for preservation planning
- Effective management
- User access
- A robust framework for all ARCW partners developed and maintained



Establishing The Project

- Survey of institutions to identify issues and barriers
- Establishment of the Project Board and COW
- Securing of start up funding from MALD
- Employment of a project officer






Survey Of Needs

Data:

- Data not being consistently created
- Data held in multiple locations: removable drives, hard drives, cloud
- Differing quantities of data being stored Lack of data management: data held in various locations, insufficient metadata creation, lack of consistency
- Varying level of data security: some open access and some restricted
- Strategic
 - Policy/advocacy
 - Governance framework
 - Technical infrastructure supporting organisational access
 - Sustainable (costings, capacity, skills)













Stakeholder Analysis

- Strategic stakeholders: project board, MALD
- Operational stakeholders: project managers and project team
- Indirect stakeholders:
 - Complexity in governance and reporting arrangements
 - Differing requirements: permanent preservation, records management requirements, research data
 - Depositors
 - Users
- Communications strategy
 - Series of events and roundtables






Developing An Appropriate Technical Infrastructure

- Further development of Archivematica, including sponsored developments





- Comparison with other options




Experience Of Managing Stakeholders Expectations
